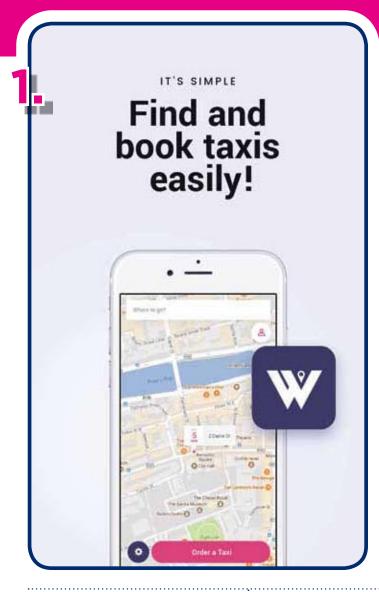

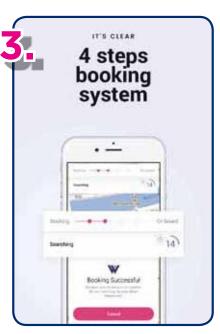

DONPT LOOK NOW.... BUT THE NITA ARE UP TO THEIR OLD TRICKS

LE THE REAL PROBLEM LIES IN PLAIN SIGHT

ust like all proper debates, lets take the argument first and then give our rebuttal.

The argument (brought to you by the NTA): Nearly 30 taxi drivers operating in Dublin have been prosecuted for doing so without a valid licence so far this year, new figures have revealed.

Figures released under Freedom of Information legislation show that 29 unlicensed Special Public Service Vehicle (SPSV) drivers were prosecuted in the capital in the first six months of 2017.

A total of 18 drivers were prosecuted across the rest of Ireland for the same offence, including in Donegal (5 drivers), Louth (3), Mayo (3 each), Westmeath (2), and Clare, Cork, Galway, Kerry, and Sligo (1 each).

The figures, the NTA say, reflect the growing trend in the last three years of drivers across the country being prosecuted for not having a relevant licence to operate a taxi.

More drivers were summonsed in the first six months of 2017 than in the whole of 2012, 2013, and 2014.

However, 2015 marked a step-up in prosecutions, with 87 drivers prosecuted that year. In 2016, 110 drivers were prosecuted.

Speaking about the figures, a spokesman for the National Transport Authority said: "The increase in prosecutions has come about as a result of NTA targeting illegal operators. This was possible as a result of us securing additional enforcement resources in 2015."

He added that the concentration of prosecutions in Dublin could be attributed to the fact that most SPSV licence holders operate in the capital.

Thank you, NTA.

A well-presented and informative stance.

And it would hold water but for one thing - or thousands as the case really is - RICKSHAWS.

How can the NTA look anyone in the eye whilst cast a dark shadow on the whole of the taxi industry over the misdeeds of a small minority of drivers when not one rickshaw driver is compliant to the same set of standards?

And so here is Tacsaí's rebuttal.

This summer Dublin City Council issued a public advisory notice warning of the safety hazards of using rickshaws.

The vehicles, which are often motorised, are a popular form of transportation for late night revellers in the city centre.

"Dublin City council wishes to advise members of the public, for their own safety and the safety of others, that rickshaws operating in Dublin City are not regulated by DCC or otherwise," the Council said in the notice posted on its website.

"Some rickshaw operators appear not to have public liability insurance," it added.

Earlier this year, it emerged that the council hoped to have rickshaws banned at some stage this year, although to date there has been no movement regarding such a course of action.

"Rickshaws are a real difficulty in in Dublin because they're unregulated," Green Party councillor Ciaran Cuffe told The Journal.ie. "We have written to the Department of Transport seeking such regulation and we're still waiting for is being turned, and hypocrisy at work. Hard at work.

that to happen."

Cuffe said that he and others are "quite frustrated" about the current regulatory situation, but stopped short of saying that a ban on rickshaws is necessary.

"I don't necessarily think that rickshaws need to be banned, but those who use them should ensure that they're insured," he said.

There have been a number of accidents with people falling out of rickshaws and of collisions with other vehicles - it's a real worry because the combination of crowds and alcohol and narrow streets is so dangerous.

"We do need to regulate these vehicles - they need to have insurance, and lights, and at least some element of driver training," he added.

And then there's this....

Last year a number of rickshaw drivers operating in Dublin City Centre were caught selling class A drugs while they work.

An Irish Independent reporter approached rickshaw drivers working in the capital and each of them confirmed they had drugs for sale.

These recordings reveal how the drivers are selling weed, cocaine and pills while working on our capital's streets.

When asked to show the pills, one of the drivers lifted up the seat of his rickshaw to reveal where he was keeping his

Another stated that they weren't "selling tonight" as gardaí were in the area and it was "too risky".

Each driver had the same set price, indicating that they may be working under the same supplier.

A source told Independent ie that some drivers keep locks on their seats to conceal their stash of drugs in case of a spot check by gardaí or Revenue.

It is believed that up to 20 rickshaw garages are currently in operation across Dublin, with two garages located on Montague Lane near the popular nightlife area of Harcourt

The main business for rickshaw drivers comes from picking up punters as they leave pubs and clubs, with the majority of drivers being of Brazilian nationality.

However, the drugs business is said to becoming increasingly popular with rickshaw drivers as a way to make extra money on the side.

Conclusion

The NTA should keep their double standards to a minimum. Note their silence on rickshaws, note their unwillingness to act on them and then ask why they are so eager to trot out some unflattering figures about the taxi industry on a quarterly basis. You, the NTA, are an umbrella authority for all pubic service vehicles. You owe the vehicles under your authority some respect. We have suggested before that for once it might be wise to broadcast some positive news about taxis rather than bombarding the public with the rogue operators. Oh, and how many of those rickshaw drivers have licenses?

How many?

If you hear nothing it's just the sound of silence, a deaf ear

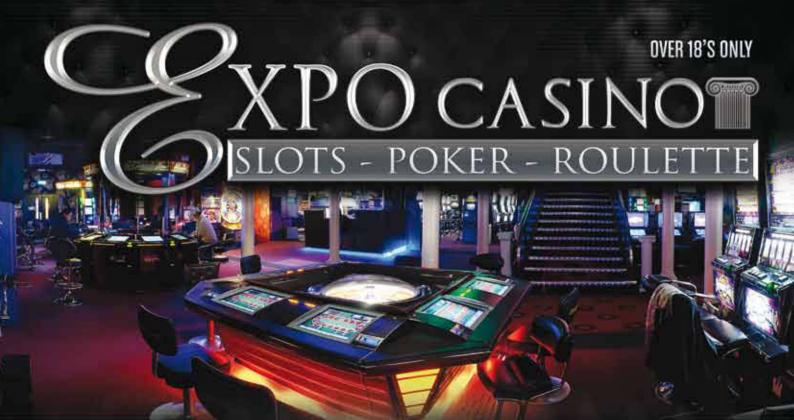

DTA ROUND ON DAWSON STREET CLOSURE AND RICKSHAWS

We hear from Tommy Barton

Tommy Barton to get a full update on the issues surrounding Dawson Street and the Luas plans. Tommy told us: "Just to keep taxi drivers up to date in relation to the Dawson Street closure to taxis at present

ust before going to print, Tacsaí spoke to the DTA's

there was a meeting held on Monday the 26th of November with Hugh Creegan of the National Transport Authority and Ben O'Brien, Dublin area manager of Dublin City Council.

"At this meeting, Dublin Taxi Association can confirm, the National Transport Authority in conjunction with Dublin City Council have decided to postpone the review of the Dawson Street issue until after Christmas.

"At this present moment only three bus routes from Dublin Bus can fully use the Dawson Street area, this has been a serious restriction for Dublin Bus considering 46 route at one stage went through and down Dawson Street.

"We believe also that any private operators for example aircoach and Mathews' coaches who have routes along that street will also be stopped from using it as well.

"It has been over three years now since taxis were fully allowed to drive down Dawson Street onto Dame and Westmoreland Street.

"DTA believe that from Cafe en Seine to the Mansion House, pubs restaurants should be able to avail of taxis at any time of the day. But by giving the new Luas line a chance to bed in over the Christmas period it would also give the National Transport Authority some breathing space on how they would like to proceed in the new year in relation to taxis fully operating down Dawson Street. We were told at this meeting that taxi drivers would be allowed to use the full length of the street at night time but the daytime is the issue at this moment it would be preferable though that we could fully operate down the street at all times.

There was a sign that buses and taxis could use Dawson Street for a few weeks but now that sign has been taken away. We don't know why that happened, but my hoping is the thinking that it may be available to us at night.

"I'd like to make the point also that it is important that we have the usage of Dawson Street and Stephen's Green as taxi drivers at this present moment. We should always pull up and set down passengers in a safe area and be conscious of the fact that the Luas will be fully operational from Saturday at 2pm (correct at the time of going to print) when Minister Ross we'll be opening the new route if we are conscious of this fact and leave the tracks clear at all times it would benefit us as drivers for this review in the new year.

"Also just a quick note on the Rickshaw issue; the minister has been sitting on his hands over the last one in regards of legislation for rickshaws we still want them banned because Dawson Street and the adjoining area will be Rickshaw Heaven now and in the future if they are not banned now that we can't fully use Dawson

"On a more positive Christmas note...

"Dublin City Council closed down one premises recently in Summerhill Ballbough area which is a great help in curtailing these death traps and many more to come.

"The industry has picked up over the last year or two at Christmas time and the DTA would like to take this opportunity to wish you and all your loved ones a safe and peaceful Christmas and New Year."



The Tralee Taxi Association has warned that one in five local taxi drivers could be forced out of business within a year as a result of new Taxi Rank arrangements for the town centre which were approved by councillors last week.

t a special meeting last week Tralee Municipal District Councillors formally approved the location of new 24-hour and night-only taxi ranks in the town centre.

Despite demands for a rank on Denny Street

Despite demands for a rank on Denny Street this was not included in the formal proposal that was put before the councillors for a vote. As such the councillors were not in a position to consider a rank on the town's main street.

They were however able to make a minor adjustment to the proposal that will see two additional 24-hour taxi spaces at Bridge Street, these will be located directly in front of Shaws Department Store and in front of 'Small' Benners hardware shop.

A rank on Denny Street was not included in the proposal despite fervent demand from local taxi drivers which was supported by a significant number of businesses and over 1,200 members of the public. Ahead of last week's meeting Tralee Taxi Association presented 1,386 signed submissions from the public backing their calls for a rank on Denny Street.

There were doubts about the legitimacy of around 125 of these signed standard letters but council management acknowledged that at least 1,200 were definitely genuine submissions.

Members of Tralee Chamber Alliance also backed the Denny Street Rank proposal. Of 63 members who responded to a TCA survey on the proposed pedestrianisation of The Mall 32 said they were on favour of a taxi rank on Denny Street.

The Tralee Traffic Strategy designed by transport planning consultancy MVA an published in 2010 recommended a rank on Denny Street but this was removed from the Tralee traffic redevelopment plan following objections from some town centre traders.

Members of the Tralee Taxi Association have said they are "disappointed but not surprised" by the councillors' decision and criticised the public consultation process as 'farcical'.

The Association has warned that the new rank system will have a disastrous impact on their members' business and could see many of them forced out of work.

"The adoption of these bye-laws will lead to job losses and there will be a reduction in the taxi fleet of at least 20 vehicles in the next 12 months," said the Association.

Such a reduction would represent almost one in five of the roughly 100 taxi drivers currently operating in Tralee.

The Association added that the new ranks would be especially problematic for non-national drivers who "don't have a busy phone trade and are hugely dependent on a workable taxi rank."

There has already been one high profile casualty.

Last Monday - just three days after the vote on the new ranks - Chairman of the Tralee Taxi Association Terry Boyle announced he was quitting the business after 26 years as a taxi driver.

"After over 26 years driving Taxis in the Tralee area I will be bowing out of the business in the coming weeks. High running costs and in particular high insurance coupled with a difficult Taxi Rank situation in Tralee at present are among the reasons for this decision," said Mr Boyle.

Mr Boyle is to take up a new job with Acorn Life next week and Windmill Cabs will continue to operate as normal.

"I would like to thank the many customers and drivers that have supported me more over the years. It is hugely appreciated," he said.

"While there were several difficult challenges along the way in those years the encouragement and support of you all made that journey a lot easier and enjoyable. I made life-long friendships with many people in those years and this is what makes this decision so difficult," he said.

"I again thank for your support over the last 26 years and hope that you will support me on my new journey. Windmill Cabs will continue to operate with Maurice James Albert and Mike continuing at the helm," Mr Boyle said.

a vicious attack on a taxi driver in this country is not hitting the headlines once again.

It is shameful that nothing more has been done by the NTA or the Department of Transport to prevent this. For years, from Sherriff Street to Tallaght, Cork City to Kilkenny, this kind of thuggery has had drivers reduced to nervous wrecks behind their wheels.

Last week a taxi driver was punched in the lip by a Moldovan man who did not have money for his fare and tried to sell the driver a \in 400 phone for \in 25.

Alexandr Tabachnic, aged 46, of an apartment at Copper Gate, Anglesea Terrace, Cork, pleaded guilty yesterday to assault causing harm.

Inspector Adrian Gamble outlined the background to the case at Cork District Court.

"Shortly before 5am on December 27, 2015, a taxi driver called into Anglesea Street Garda Station.

"The driver said he picked up a fare on Evergreen Road who wanted to go to Greenmount. He didn't know precisely where in that area.

"He [the passenger] showed him a box containing €400 phone

and speakers. He said he would sell it for €50 and later said €25. The taxi driver refused several times.

"He pointed out a house at Gould St. He said he would drop in and get the money to pay for the ride.

"The driver agreed if the box could be left in the car until he returned with the money. He said he would call the gardaí if he did not return. The man became aggressive when there was mention of the gardaí. Suddenly without warning the driver received a blow to the upper lip from this man.

"About 30 minutes later the driver saw the same man on Bishop's St. He drove behind him at a distance and called that gardaí. He identified him to Sgt Seán O'Donoghue at Grand Parade a few minutes later."

The defendant also pleaded guilty to counts of shoplifting where he stole bottles of perfume from a number of pharmacies.

Eddie Burke, solicitor, said the defendant had a heroin problem at the time but was now clean, working part-time, and trying to get back into education.

Judge Aingil Ní Chondúin told the accused to bring €300 to court as compensation. "If he does that he gets a suspended sentence of eight months. Otherwise it is the real McCoy," the judge said.

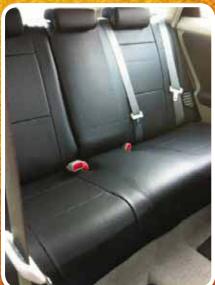

eanwhile, mytaxi is offering a total of €1 million in incentives to the first 500 drivers who pass the test needed to enter the taxi sector and drive for mytaxi, the e-hailing app has announced.

The €2,000 per-driver offer is available to the first 500 who pass the Small Public Service Vehicles (SPSV) entry test using the new mytaxi online manual and become active mytaxi drivers.

Tim Arnold, General Manager of mytaxi Ireland, said: "This announcement is intended to boost our taxi fleet by as much as 5% by early next year and is another big push by us to increase taxi supply in Ireland to meet the surging demand. In 2016 three drivers retired from the industry for every new driver who passed the SPSV test – we badly need to reverse this trend and recruit more drivers to service huge customer demand, especially at peak times. We are continuing to call on potential taxi drivers to consider the real career possibilities that are on offer by entering the sector and we're keen to provide them with our financial and technical support to do so."

The €2,000 offer is broken into two parts. The €1000 reward covers €90 for the SPSV test fee, €250 for the SPSV licenses, with the balance to be used at the taxi driver's discretion to cover other setup costs associated such as car rental or purchase, smartphone purchase, and insurance. The €1000 payment will be made to drivers in four instalments of €250 per week for the first four weeks, once they become an active mytaxi driver.

The second part of €1000 is an additional sign-up:

bonus that a driver can earn on completion of 60 jobs per week after the first 4 weeks with mytaxi. Drivers must pass the SPSV industry entry test before January 31, 2018.

The online resource is available to anyone free of charge, on condition they sign up to drive with mytaxi once they pass the SPSV test which mytaxi also pays for. The content available helps users prepare for both the Dublin Area Knowledge and Industry Knowledge parts.

We hear from the Chairman of the Cork Taximen's Association

erry Coughlan is the Chairman of the Cork Taximen's Association. Founded in 1938 it is the oldest representative body in the country. Having driven taxis for 39 years, Derry has been a taxi owner all of that time too, and he is of the belief that these days something is rotten in the state of Denmark.

He told us: "Recently a submission was made (by us) to the NTA about the poor development of the taxi transport system since deregulation and the removal of the Garda Carriage Office functions, with self regulation instead taking over, which is dangerous and non-protective, and is being hijacked these days by the 'digital sharecroppers'. This is not what the service needs. Taxi rank legislation must be updated and upgraded overall, along with proper safety screens, signage, road markings, public guideline notices and heavy fines for parking or leaving vehicles unattended.

"We also feel that presentation of the transport services is very important to the image of our country. People hiring a cab are not impressed if it is not clean, same for the dress code of the driver. Drivers must be informative and give reasonable value for money too. These are important factors in our business.

"I also feel, to support drivers, the government should omit taxes on new vehicles to assist the operator provide a quality care in the industry - you should be able to claim back your vehicle taxes in cash refunds

etc. This country needs to wake up and financially support our industry."

The Cork Taximen's Association are also concerned about the rise in rickshaws not just in the city of Cork, but nationwide.

Derry added: "Rickshaws are not public transport and therefore must not be permitted to operate in cities, especially in public places. They violate many rules, bye laws and regulations and safety and public liability problems arise. This manually operated equipment is not to public transport specification and it has limits of safety and welfare precautions.

"People under the influence of alcohol/drugs etc are never permitted to operate taxis so why rickshaws? The current illegal system competing with taxis in public places must be banned forever.

"If investors want to form such a business under the Freedom Act they must have an office and private off-street store yards where people can go to just like any other business during day time hours, but such a business is not fit for night work, in the dark, the wet and the frosty nights. They are a big obstruction to other road users and pedestrians.

"The new breed of civil servant and law society would want to realise that cities are not amusement parks, therefore the Pavement Act would want to be restored under present circumstances and street conduct/behaviour."

But Dáil TDs raise concerns about drivers who are still being forced out of the industry as Tony Roe also calls for further reductions

hough the issue has been raised and debated, and discussed at length, concerns have been raised again. in the Dáil that taxi drivers are being forced out of their jobs as a result of continually rising insurance premiums.

During a debate urging the government to implement an action plan set out in the Report on the Cost of Motor Insurance, several TDs spoke about the need to curb insurance for the sake of taxi drivers' jobs.

Fianna Fail TD Michael McGrath said rising premiums were discriminating against several types of drivers, including younger and older drivers.

Among the challenges he said drivers of all kinds faced as a result of rising premiums were taxi drivers who were "being driven out of business" because of high quotes.

He said: "We know from the declined cases agreement with Insurance Ireland that the number of people who simply cannot get a quote has multiplied elevenfold in the past four years."

Mr McGrath's party colleague John Lahart added that he knew of two drivers whose premiums had increased €1,800 in two years, a figure he called "colossal".

People Before Profit TD Richard Boyd-Barrett also said the Government had an obligation to make insurance affordable for those who needed it for a living, given that having it is a legal

He said: "Taxi drivers are literally being put out of business by these guys. If one has the slightest prang - of course, one is going to have small prangs if one is driving all the time for a living - one

"Premiums are already massively high and people who have never had accidents are getting premiums of €17,000 and €20,000, which are ridiculous figures. That is not sustainable for taxi drivers.

"Of course, over the course of driving for a living, one is going to have some little accident, which is not even one's fault. It could be a small thing, but that is it - one is out of a job."

Dublin Central TD Maureen O'Sullivan echoed Mr Boyd-Barrett's

comments, saying that in some cases she had seen taxi insurance increases to over €10,000. She said: "Taxi drivers use their cars to make a living. I have numerous constituents who are taxi drivers and they tell me they cannot afford to work. Their taxis are off the road because of the huge increase in insurance. "These are taxi drivers who have completed all the tests. They are adhering to very stringent standards, including the NCT and public service yearly checks. They are dealing with increasing antisocial behaviour on the part of some customers. They are providing a service and are being crippled by the rise. I have seen increases of insurance up to over €10,000. Now, Tony Roe, Chairman of the National Transport Assembly Committee, has some good news for taxi drivers for a change. He said: "Since we contacted the European Commission to investigate accusations of a cartel operating the in the Irish insurance industry that resulted in insurance companies being raided by the Gardaí. Now we are starting to see some policies being reduced at an alarming rate, which is welcome news, but further reductions are needed. "Now that insurance companies are making large profits exploitation of transport workers must stop and we want government ministers to stop sitting on the fence on this issue and means the Minister for Transport, Shane Ross, in particular. We want to see him acting here and being more proactive o n the matter. "Taxis are the only form of public transport that are available 24 hours a day 7 days a week, 365 days of the year and are under the NTA's umbrella and yet we feel like we're being subdued. We are the biggest contributor to revenue of all the transport systems and drivers just feel like they're maligned by the government - only seen as a form of raising revenue. "Taxis all over Europe have standard, fair insurance premiums and those are implemented and monitored by their governments. This happens all over Europe, in all the other big European capitals and cities. So we'd like the Minister now to stop this fantasy, fairytale carry on and we want insurance legislation to be implemented here and for it to be fairer for taxi workers. "All the minister seems to do now is urge people to do his job and we want input from Shane Ross. We feel that's needed. Not evasive cop-outs that are random and unnecessary by the

government.

he Dublin City Centre Luas works have caused chaos, widespread and total chaos for years now in the capital.

What was supposed to be a "clean and swift

operation" has turned calm into calamity every which way but loose across the Fair City.

Local businessmen have complained, other public transport modes have voiced their displeasure, and of course the Luas works have wreaked havoc with the taxi industry. Ranks have been displaced – most never to return – and it seems to anyone with a keen eye and sharp wit that the government are steering the public ever closer to a Luas City where taxis and maybe even buses no longer get their fair crack of the whip on the streets of Dublin.

All of this added to the College Green shambles, and many have the right to be feeling disgruntled.

Yes. Drivers are furious about this eventuality, and also the massive disruption caused during the endless building process. We spoke to Dave McGuinness of the TTnH to hear his take on things are they currently stand.

He said: "As taxi drivers are aware the Luas Cross City project has been ongoing for a number of years. This project has seen many prime taxi stands becoming Luas Stops, and the works have caused considerable disruption to taxis and customers in the City Centre.

"At the start of this project and through three years of negotiating we had offered many alternatives to Dublin City Council, however none of our proposals have been adopted to date. It is expected the larger trams will come on stream in February 2018 and Dublin City Council have relayed it is their intention to ban taxis travelling through College Green, whilst allowing private coaches and buses carriage through the corridor.



"This is totally unacceptable to drivers and will cause huge problems. Currently we are corresponding with all stakeholders in the industry. We would hope for a show of unity from all sectors of the industry on this important issue. We would request all drivers contact their local political representatives and make their views known.

"This proposal is anti-competitive to taxis, would add huge costs to customers due to the circuitous route been taken and we reject the precedent this proposal sets in banning taxis from certain parts of the city. We are currently in talks and would hope for a favourable resolution. We will keep drivers informed on this issue."

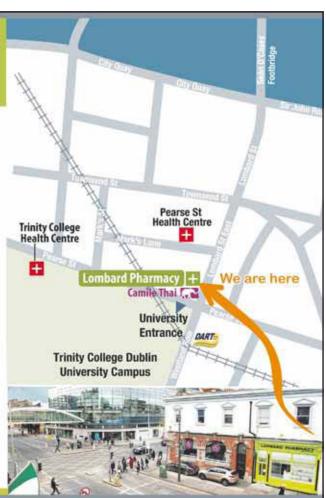

CHRISTMAS DRIVER SHORTAGE CRISIS

COUNCILLOR WARNS OF FESTIVE CHAOS THIS YEAR

Dublin City Councillor is warning that the city risks returning to a taxi shortage because of rocketing insurance premiums.

Fianna Fáil's Paul McAuliffe says that taxi drivers are being forced to leave the industry.

He says he has already been inundated by complaints from many Dublin residents who have been left waiting for taxis.

"Well we've seen increasingly over the past three years the cost of car insurance increase, but those in the taxi industry have been particularly impacted," he said.

"The real issue now is that we're being increasingly getting taxi drivers who are coming to us saying that they can't enter the market because insurance companies will not insure them.

"This week alone, I've had two people contacting me saying that they just cannot get a quote."

Demand for taxi services is now at an all-time high in Dublin.

New drivers are struggling to achieve the 80% needed to pass the new NTA Small Public Service Vehicles (SPSV) entry test.

Only 20% of those who sit the test are passing.

There are concerns there will be a shortage of taxi drivers coming into the busy Christmas period in the capital.

Three drivers retired for every new entrant to the industry in 2016.

Tim Arnold, General Manager of mytaxi Ireland has launched a online platform to help potential drivers learn "the knowledge".

He said: "There are fewer taxi drivers operating now than at any time in the last 10 years and one of the barriers to new drivers entering the industry is this text.

"It's not the only thing, you also need to have a vehicle that has high insurance costs and all new taxis must be wheelchair accessible.

"There are a number of barriers that have to be overcome,

but we're confident that with more drivers passing entrance exams, they'll be able to help interested parties get into taxis and get driving."

Mr Arnold says their online learning platform can help potential drivers pass the test.

He said: "Our platform will help you prepare the area knowledge part of the test, where you are asked do you know which street in particular, museums or hotels are.

"We've developed the course material with the help of data from 20 million taxi journeys to identify the most important locations for taxi drivers to know."

Meanwhile, Joe Herron, president of the Irish Taxi Drivers' Federation, said that that a huge number of drivers are leaving the industry as the economy continues to improve.

"At its peak you were talking about roughly the same amount of taxis operating in Dublin as there are in London", he said.

"Other jobs have become available now and loads of people have left the business."

Meanwhile, A man who took part in the robbery of a taxi driver and was caught using a tracker on his victim's mobile phone has been jailed for three and a half years.

Carl Cullen (30), who has a number of relatives that work as taxi drivers, apologised to his victim. He said the robbery had occurred during a "night of absolute madness."

Cullen, of Dingle Road, Cabra, Dublin pleaded guilty at Dublin Circuit Criminal Court to robbery at Tolka Valley Road on February 27, 2017. He has 40 previous convictions.

Garda Barry Hehir told Fiona Murphy BL, prosecuting, that Cullen and a co-accused jumped into the taxi at about 6 am and asked to go to Finglas. The driver was a bit worried as the men were acting strangely and seemed drunk and high on drugs.

At Tolka Valley Road the man in the passenger seat pulled up the handbrake. The driver asked him to stop but the man then began pulling at the steering wheel. Cullen, who was in the back, also began grabbing the steering wheel.



The taxi driver, fearing they would crash, stopped the car. The men were acting aggressively and he got out of the car, fearing for his own safety. He went to take his phone with him but Cullen grabbed it out of his hand.

Cullen chased the victim and tried to punch his head, but missed landing a punch on his shoulder.

The taxi driver stayed about 40 metres away from his car. CCTV footage showed the two robbers "rummaging" through the taxi before running off. A number of items were taken including a phone, MP3 player and bag of coins.

Gardai were alerted and the victim was able to tell them the location of his phone using a "find phone" setting. Gardai brought him to the location given and the victim pointed out Cullen and his co-accused walking along St Helena's Road in Finglas.

Gda Hehir agreed with Pieter Le Vert BL, defending, that some of the items had been strewn along the side of the road but that most of the stolen belongings had been

recovered. Mr Le Vert said Cullen, a father of three, had been living at a hostel at the time, where he met his co-accused, and this offence occurred at the end of a three day drinking session. He said his client described it as "a night of absolute madness."

Counsel said his client has a number of relatives who work as taxi drivers and knows how hard it is.

He said Cullen, who began drinking and using cocaine following a bereavement, had shown promise as an athlete. He submitted his client was "of a certain age" and was not without prospects.

Judge Martin Nolan said this was a particularly frightening episode during which the taxi driver had been confronted by two intoxicated and violent men.

He took into account Cullen's guilty plea, remorse and his athletic promise. He also noted his previous record of offending and his propensity for violence. He imposed a three and a half year sentence.

"With the help of the Dublin Taxi Drivers and : their time and gene some of our sponsors and supporters namely : most. Well done all!

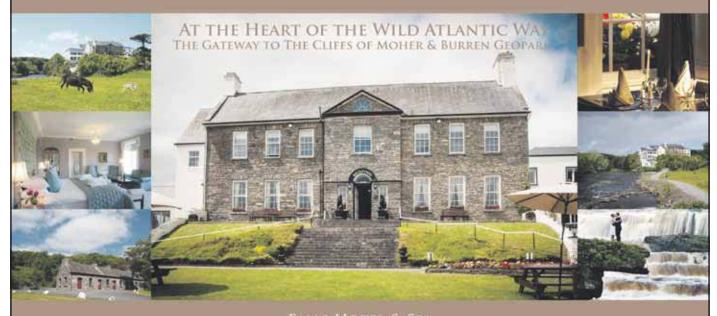

SPAIN

Striking taxi drivers caused major disruption across Spain last week as they demanded tighter regulation of digital companies like Uber, which they warn could soon wipe out their industry.

In Madrid, Barcelona and many other cities, drivers observed the 24-hour strike, which began at 6am. The action caused severe problems for many commuters and travellers, with airports and railway stations affected. In Madrid thousands of taxi drivers from across Spain gathered for a march through the centre of the city to congress, which they said should act to supervise digital apps offering transport services.

"Our livelihood is being taken from us. All we can do is fight for our families," said Alberto "Tito" Álvarez, spokesman for the elite Taxi company, which has been prominent in the campaign against Uber and its competitor Cabify.

"They're destroying society," he said. "Uber doesn't just work with taxis, it works in delivery, and other areas. It wants to Uber-ise the economy ... But this isn't the United States, this is Europe."

Last week's strike was sparked by a supreme court ruling earlier this month that granted operating licences, previously blocked by local authorities, to Uber and similar companies. Although only 80 licences were approved, the taxi industry claims the ruling sets a precedent that will see thousands more granted, thus flooding the market.

Existing Spanish legislation allows only one licence to be issued for so-called VTCs, or private driven vehicles such as those operated by Uber and Cabify, for every 30 taxi permits in circulation. However, the taxi sector has long complained that this ratio is not respected. Undersecretary for transport Julio Gómez-Pomar admitted on Wednesday that the number of VTC licences in use is triple that allowed by the law.

"Markets can be liberalised, society can be liberalised, but it has to be very strictly regulated, supervised and balanced," said Elpidio José Silva, a lawyer representing several taxi organisations.

AUSTRALIA

A man has allegedly robbed a taxi driver at knifepoint disguised as an

elderly woman called Fatima.

Sydney man Kemal Yalim, 24, put on a dress, cardigan and scarf that covered his face and booked a taxi under the name Fatima, police allege.

He allegedly waited at a Coogee apartment block at 6.35am on April 16 and asked the cab driver to take him to Westfield Eastgardens shopping centre, The Daily Telegraph reported.

When the taxi got to the shopping centre Fatima allegedly grabbed the driver's neck and cut his chest with a knife.

Jesse Ruth Moore, 33, was waiting at the shopping centre for Fatima and the driver, according to court documents.

She yelled 'give me money, give me money.' The pair allegedly made off with \$30.

Yalim's lawyer Stephen Alexander told The Daily Telegraph his client will fight the charges against him.

Mr Alexander said: 'Identity and gender will be an issue in this case.'

Yalim is charged with armed robbery. Moore is charged with robbery in company and breaching bail.

The pair will appear in court on December 12.

ROME

Authorities in Rome have started classes for hundreds of its taxi drivers to learn good manners and English.

The city said 750 drivers are scheduled to take eight classes of "practical" English, lessons about "cultural manners" as well as instructions on how to make visitors feel welcome in Italy's capital.

In a country that greatly lives off tourism, Italians' command of English and other foreign languages is often shaky in the sector.

Earlier this week, tourists had a hard time finding any Rome cabbie, well-mannered or not.

The city's cab drivers had joined a nationwide, day-long taxi strike to protest against competition from Uber-style drivers as well as private entrepreneurs who have taken to buying sleek, black vans, getting local driver-for-hire licences and driving small groups of tourists around town.



LIVERPOOL

A woman claims a black hackney driver threw her out on the MOTORWAY after she threw up in his cab.

Vicky Abbott, from Liverpool, said she was left drunkenly walking down the M53, after the driver slammed on his brakes and ordered her to get out - close to the Moreton Spur roundabout.

The 30-year-old claims the driver began screaming and swearing at her, after she threw up in his car and ordered her to pay him £40.

But when she told him she did not have the money and would need to get it from home - she claims he locked her in the taxi and told her he was taking her to a police station, before instead dumping her on the motorway, near junction 1.

Vicky, who works for Wirral Council, said: "I knew I had done wrong and drank too much and I said to him, 'I don't have £40 on me but I will get it from home or clean it up'.

"But he was just screaming and shouting at me saying 'you are going to have to pay for this' and then said he was taking me to a police station.

"I was locked in the back of the cab and he was stopping people and asking them where the nearest police station was.

"Then he said 'I am taking you back to Liverpool."

Vicky, who had got in the taxi with a friend, near Debenhams on North John Street, was in the taxi alone at this point and said he became aggressive when she questioned where he was taking her.

She said: "We had dropped my friend in Leasowe and he literally drove past my road saying he was taking me back to Liverpool.

He said 'you are not being f*****g sick in my car' and then slammed the brakes on, so I came off my seat.

"Then he said 'get out the f******g car and put his arm through and pushed me out.

"It was only when I got out that I realised I was in the middle of the motorway.

"It was teeming down and there were no lights or hard shoulder and there were cars going 70mph coming towards me."

ITALY

Taxi drivers across Italy were on strike Tuesday last, as unions protest against competition from Uber and other new rivals.

The strike lasted from 8am to 10pm, with a protest in Rome.

The strike was called on Monday night after talks between union leaders rejected "unacceptable" proposals from the Italian Ministry of Transport.

Taxi drivers argue that the government has unfairly deregulated the market, allowing multinationals and private ride-hailing companies such as Uber to take advantage.

Unions are calling for tighter rules on where drivers are allowed to operate. Taxi drivers can only work in areas they have a license for, while Uber and other car-hire services are not restricted to a single zone.

Italy's deputy minister of transport, Riccardo Nencini, called the strike "unjustified". According to him, drivers' unions rejected the government's proposals to crack down on abuses and regulate new technology, with some drivers demanding an outright ban on ridehailing apps.

Italy is not considering outlawing private-hire services, Nencini said, but

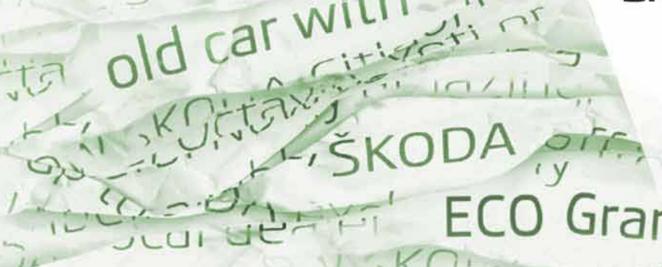

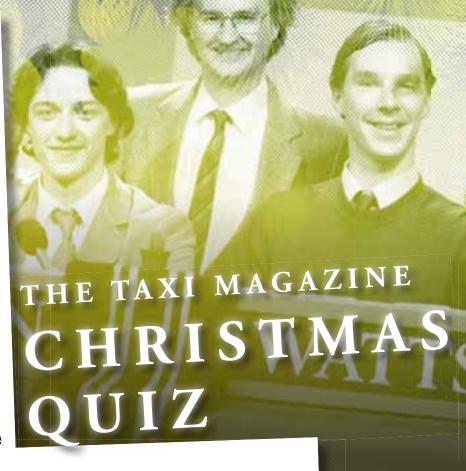
